San Carlos, Ariz.-- Each year the San Carlos Apache Tribe and Apache Gold Casino Resort sets aside funding; which is commonly known as 12D Funding. This funding is distributed to surrounding cities, towns, and/or county non-profit organizations on an annual basis through a stringent selection process.

In years past, applications would be submitted and they would select three recipients, but this year but, like so many other local businesses and non-profit organizations, the San Carlos Apache Gaming Enterprise (SCAGE) had unique challenges from recovering in 2020. Although,, they stayed committed and awarded a well-deserved non-profit organization and this year they were only able to give it to the Town of Winkelman in the amount \$24,118.24, The additional funding would assist towards replacing old radios & communications equipment.

The partnership with the Town of Winkelman dates back many years. So it only seemed fitting to reach out with some financial assistance through the town's police department. The Town of Winkelman police department area encompasses 450 square miles, which includes the Apache Sky Casino and surrounding communities of Dudleyville, Kearny, Mammoth and San Manuel.
